Dick Shrum and I joined the zoom meeting. The VFN President is Bob Martin who belongs to the Fredericksburg Chapter 90. Six members attended the NARFE September 15th meeting which opened with the pledge and prayer.

The minutes and treasurer's report of the previous meeting were approved after a motion by Robert Maher, seconded by Gerald Root.

The VA Federation is pushing WEP and GPO. This has 40 sponsors in the Senate. The military was granted \$10,000 not taxable this year which increases annually to \$40,000.

Dick Shrum presented interesting facts about Lake Superior, the largest freshwater lake in the world.

The chapter has decided to send a survey to all members to learn how to enhance our attendance.

PROGRAM

While the last meeting was primarily about the future of the chapter, we were able to take 5 minutes for a brief review of one of the truly amazing things in our great country. "Why it's called Lake Superior!" It contains 10% of all the fresh water on Earth, as much as Lakes Michigan, Huron, Ontario and 4 Erie's combined. It covers almost 32,000 square miles, its deepest point in 1,333 feet, and there are 78 different species of fish that call it home. And that is just part of why we call it "SUPERIOR".

Again, our October meeting will be mainly about our future, and whether and/or how the chapter should proceed, as laid out in the President's column. However, there are a couple of topics that we can discuss in the Programs portion of the meeting. First, I will have some Virginia election information, voter registration procedures, and sample ballots from the various precincts of Louisa so you can know what to expect when you vote this Fall. NATIONAL LEGISLATION REPORT

Fiscal Year 2023 Budget process update:

The Senate passed a continuing resolution (CR) this morning. The CR would fund the government through Dec. 16. The senate passed CR, also provides \$12.3 billion for assistance to Ukraine and an additional \$1 billion for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). The House should take up the CR tomorrow then it would go to the President for his signature. President Biden has said that he is waiting to sign the CR. Other items of interest:

* Medicare Part B Premium and Deductible are scheduled to decrease for 2023. The Medicare Part B standard monthly premium will be \$164.90, a decrease of \$5.20 from \$170.10 in 2022. The annual deductible for all Medicare Part B beneficiaries will be \$226, a decrease of \$7 from the annual deductible of \$233 in 2022. Social Security Fairness Act of 2021. We talked about this last month, and you should have received emails from NARFE about HB 82 being scheduled for a vote by the full House of representatives on Sep 19th. However, the House Ways and Means committee took up the bill on Sep 19th thereby pulling it from the full house schedule. The committee voted by unanimous consent to move H.R.82 out of committee without recommendation. I don't know when the bill will be scheduled by for consideration in the

full house, however there are 303 co-sponsors.

That and the companion Senate Bill 1302 -is at a critical juncture since the 117th session of congress ends Dec 31, 2022. After this week, congress will only be in session a short time in October then back home until after the November election.

Consider going to the advocacy page of the NARFE.org website where there is a letter already prepared and ask our senators to become cosponsors.
