Remote Anesthesia? Audit Calls for Tighter Controls of Telehealth Costs in FEHB

The rapid expansion of telehealth services in the FEHB program due to the pandemic has increased the risks of violations of patients' privacy and of improper billing, the inspector general's office at OPM has said.

The report is the latest in a series from the IG calling for controls on costs that are passed on in the form of premiums for both enrollees and the government, following several focusing on ineligible persons getting coverage as family members.
