Here is his Bio: I have a degree in Forestry from Virginia Tech. I worked for the DoD for 35 years, 28 with the Corps of Engineers. Photogrammetry, Terrain analysis, surveying and LOTS of field work as a vegetation specialist.

I became a Virginia Master Naturalist in 2009, I have been President of the local chapter since 2020. I teach tree/plant ID. lead nature walks in Spotsylvania County and at James Madison's Montpelier.

I have been doing citizen science projects with vernal pools for for most of that time, counting spotted and marbled salamander eggs and reproduction cycles. In doing the vernal pool assessments I have become familiar with wood frogs as well.

I will talk about Vernal pools and Salamanders of Virginia. Virginia is host to 53 different species of salamanders 2nd only to NC with 56.
