## **LEGISLATION**

#### **Federal**

The Social Security Fairness Act of 2023, The Social Security Fairness Act, <u>H.R.82/S.597</u> would fully repeal the WEP and GPO. H.R.82 has 306 co-sponsors. S.597 has 50 cosponsors including Senator Tim Kaine. NARFE President Bill Shackelford wrote a <u>letter</u> to the House Ways and Means Committee asking them to bring this bill to the floor for a vote. The holdup is offsetting the cost of Social Security increases if the bill is passed.

Del Dyer spoke about <u>H.R.281 - Bipartisan Social Security</u> <u>Commission Act of 2023</u>. Ask your legislators NOT to cosponsor or vote for this bill. (It only has two co-sponsors.)

#### Virginia

Delegate Sam Rasoul has introduced <u>HB 1078 Family Caregiver</u>, which creates a nonrefundable income tax credit for taxable years 2024 through 2028. Delegate Vivian Watts has introduced <u>HB 886 Certified Nursing Facilities</u> which addresses administrative sanctions, facilities subject to minimum standards.

#### FEBRUARY 2024 MEETING MINUTES

NARFE Roanoke Valley Chapter 111, Area VII, met on Friday, February 2, 2024 at Jersey Lily's restaurant. Frances Boatman, President conducted the meeting. The meeting was called to order at 11:56 a.m. with 27 people in attendance including two guests, one new member, and our guest speaker and his wife. A quorum was present to conduct chapter business.

February birthdays were recognized.

Wanda Ware spoke about February, the month celebrating love and International Friendship. She led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Secretary's minutes for the January 2024 meeting were approved as published by acclamation.

Ellie Long, Secretary, reported two member deaths and presented Distinguished Service Citations to Jean Mays, Claudine Ratcliffe (via Sue King), and Ora McCoy (via Frances Boatman). She read a letter from Catawba Hospital staff thanking us for our 2023 Operation Santa donations.

Mark Fisher gave the January 2024 treasurer's report.

Carolyn Tucker, 1<sup>st</sup> VP, gave the membership report. Currently there are 155 chapter members. **Welcome to new members Suzanne Williamson and Anna Yu.** 

Karen Simmons,  $2^{nd}$  VP, thanked Anne Cepeda for arranging the January program and announced the March program speaker.

Bill Ketron gave the Legislation report.

Dr. Leon Vinci, CDL District 6, reminded us to review the NARFE Bill Tracker each month in NARFE magazine.

Frances gave the President's report.

New Business: Leon Vinci made a motion, Carolyn Tucker seconded to spend up to \$70 for an Alzheimer's Fund basket to be auctioned at the conference; motion approved by acclamation. Wanda Ware will put it together. Bill Ketron made a motion, Leon Vinci seconded to spend \$110 for a full page chapter ad and \$110 for a full page ad for VFN President Frances Boatman in the Conference Book; motion approved by acclamation. Leon Vinci made a motion to reimburse \$75 conference registration fees for up to seven chapter members attending the conference; motion approved by acclamation.

Shannon Abell, AARP Community Ambassador, was our guest speaker. <u>Immunizations</u>. Annual flu shot; Covid Omicron bivalent booster; updated Prevnar 20 and Pneumovax 23 pneumonia shots (check when you last had them); RSV; Shingrix shingles; Tetanus shot every 5-10 years are available at no cost. If in question, review your drug plan. Consider getting the Hepatitis A vaccine which may have co-pays.

In 2024, COLAs went up 3.2%; the Medicare Part B Premium went up 5.9% to \$174.70 per month.

Two sources of help: Carilion Medication Assistance Program, 540-772-8721, with drug costs based on income. LOA with Medicare Open Season Enrollment (Non FEHB open season). LOA can help fill out an application to a get drug plan.

You must be <u>admitted</u> to the hospital to be eligible for Part A payments. You must be in **admitted status** and spend three "midnights" in the hospital to be eligible for skilled nursing care.

Medicare Advantage; be cautious in choosing such a plan. All customers do not qualify for benefits. You may get free benefits but medical tests and treatments may be denied. You can appeal but it takes time. They are not good for chronic conditions. These plans do not travel well if you see out of network providers. You cannot go back to a Medigap plan without going through underwriting.

#### **Scam Tips**

- -- Mail checks **inside** at the Post Office.
- --Purchase a <u>Uniball Signo 307</u> pen and use it to write checks.
- -Do not purchase "free" plastic or "new" Medicare cards.
- -IRS, Social Security, and Medicare **do not call you**. They notify in writing,
- -Do not click on computer pop ups that say your computer has been taken over. Turn it off. Don't call any phone numbers.
