LEGISLATION

Federal

The Social Security Fairness Act of 2023. The Social Security Fairness Act, <u>H.R.82/S.597</u> would fully repeal the WEP and GPO. H.R.82 has 323 co-sponsors. S.597 has 62 co-sponsors including both Virginia Senators.

<u>Promote grassroots actions by NARFE members</u> <u>in your chapters and federations.</u>

There are several ways you can promote GAM activities:

- Share information about Grassroots Advocacy Month via your chapter and federation newsletters. <u>Check</u> out our NARFE Voices Archive.
- Share educational modules with members. We have an arsenal of brief educational videos offering insights on various ways to enhance advocacy skills like a social media "how to" tutorial, effectively engaging with lawmakers, and more. <u>Check them</u> <u>out!</u>

Community Events

If you have the time to catch a member of Congress at a community event in August, such as a town hall (in-person or virtual), that's a great way to reinforce the grassroots actions NARFE members are taking in the district or state. By engaging in these interactions, you will not only have the chance to convey our priorities effectively but also establish meaningful connections with lawmakers and their staff, providing for a deeper level of engagement.

Action Letters

Action letters are direct, personal appeals to lawmakers. They are hard evidence of constituent engagement and concern. Urge your lawmakers to take action on our main GAM priorities to help push policy change through the legislative process.

Social Media

Social media is a powerful advocacy tactic that enables us to reach a wide audience and engage with lawmakers directly. Just like our action letters, we also have Twitter (now "X") campaigns up to send a quick Tweet. If you have an account, a sample Tweet will automatically populate to send. If not, follow our <u>short Twitter guide</u> to send a Tweet in a few steps or watch our <u>five-minute tutorial</u>. We realize that not everyone will use Twitter, but we highly encourage it since it is a valuable way to get a lawmaker's attention. Remember, most all of Congress uses Twitter (about 98% according to the Congressional Management Foundation (CMF).

Letter to the Editor (LTE) Campaign

Local media outlets are excellent platforms for raising awareness and influencing public opinion when members of Congress are back in their districts/localities. Share your personal stories and make known the issues that affect the federal community to your local newspaper/media source to grab the attention of your lawmakers, and the public, especially if your letter is published. We have <u>sample LTEs to</u> <u>access</u> for all GAM issues as well, and a <u>guide</u> to walk you through.

Fact Sheet/Information Flyer

For your convenience, we have created a <u>condensed fact sheet</u> that can double as an informational flyer that you can reference in meetings/discussions and circulate. This resource will provide you with quick facts in supporting your message, and additionally can be shared with friends, family, and community members in enhancing awareness and action.

Your commitment to grassroots advocacy and your role as grasstops members is vital to shaping our policy issues, inspiring lawmakers to take actions protecting our federal community. Thank you for your leadership during Grassroots Advocacy Month.
