#### **Advocacy Priorities-Slide 1**

#### WEP/GPO Repeal or Reform

- Social Security Fairness Act, H.R. 82/S.597
  - 329 cosponsors as of 9/15/24
  - 218 Discharge Petition 9/19/24
  - 327 votes to pass 11/12/24!!!

(VA VOTES--5 yes, 3 no, 3 nonvoting)



 Continue to increase cosponsorship for S. 597---62 cosponsors in Senate (as of 11/10/24) VA Senators are co-sponsors



#### **More Accurate COLAs for FERS Retirees**

- Support of the Equal COLA Act, H.R. 866/ S. 3194, ensuring FERS COLAs match the change in consumer prices (and the CSRS COLA)
  - 79 cosponsors for H.R. 866 as of 11/10/24 (Connolly bill, 3 VA Cosponsors—Spanberger, McClellan, Wexton
  - 11 cosponsors for S. 3194 as of 11/10/24
     (Sen. Padilla CA Bill, no VA cosponsors)
- If CPI increases above 2%, FERS retirees do not receive full COLA
  - If between 2% and 3%, FERS COLA = 2%
  - If above 3%, FERS COLA = CPI minus 1%

#### **Advocacy Priorities-Slide 3**

#### **Federal Pay**

- Support market-rate federal pay increases
  - 5.2% increase for 2024
  - Parity with military pay raise
  - Based on recent changes in private-sector wages and salaries
  - Biden issued alternative pay play to provide 4.7% across-the-board increase, plus 0.5% increase to locality pay (signed into law 12/23)
- For 2025, NARFE supports a 4.5 % increase with 4% across- the board increase, plus .05% increase for locality (market-rate)
- President Biden FY25 Budget Proposal includes 2% raise







#### Improving Government and Protecting the Merit System

- Support the Saving the Civil Service Act, H.R. 1002/S.399
  - Would prohibit return of Schedule F, protect merit based civil service (58-cosponsors House; 20 cosponsors Senate)
  - Connolly Bill, Co sponsors-- Spanberger, Wexton, Beyer, McClellan---Kaine Bill, Warner co-sponsor
- Support H.R. 159/ S. 59, Chance to Compete Act
  - Would improve cross-agency hiring, expand the use of subject matter experts in the hiring process, and primarily focus on an individual's relevant experience and skills rather than self-ratings and degrees
  - Passed the House 422-2 (3 cosponsors Senate)
- Support additional efforts to modernize federal human capital management



#### **Improving Government & Protecting the Merit System**

- Support OPM Final Rule "Upholding Civil Service Protections and Merit System Principles
- a. Notice & comment would be required
- b. No loss of competitive service protections if involuntarily reclassified
- c. Appeal rights for employees involuntarily reclassified
- **OPPOSE** Public Service Reform Act H.R. 3115/ S.1496
- H.R. 3115 (Roy, TX; 15 cosponsors Cline, Good )
- S. 1496 (Scott, FL; 1 cosponsor)

#### **Advocacy Priorities- Slide 6**

#### **OPM Customer Service**

- Support improvements to OPM customer service NARFE has continued to receive member complaints on OPM customer service
- Progress
  - House appropriations committee report
    - Includes NARFE-drafted language expressing concerns about OPM customer service levels, requests reporting on progress
  - Senate appropriations committee report
    - Directs increased funding levels to improving OPM customer service, IT modernization, and implementation of the Postal Service Health Benefits program



#### **Protect Earned Retirement and Health Benefits**

 Oppose cuts to earned retirement and health benefits

#### • Past congressional proposals (opposed) include:

- Increased contributions toward retirement
- Reducing rate of return on TSP G fund
- Reductions to/Elimination of COLAs
- Elimination of FERS annuity supplement
- Eliminate FERS entirely
- Increase employee share of FEHB premiums



#### **Improve Medicare Integration with FEHB**

- Support policies to reduce health care costs through improved integration of Medicare with FEHB
  - Maintain choice for retirees re: Medicare Part B enrollment
  - Provide more plan options that provide reimbursement for Medicare Part B premiums, increase reimbursement amounts
  - Ensure FEHB plans benefit from prescription drug prices negotiated by the Department of Health and Human Services for Medicare Part D plans
  - Allow cost savings through Part D integration to gain benefits, including new ones from Inflation Reduction Act:

#### Recommendations—For the 119<sup>th</sup> Congress—JAN. 2025

- Include language applying FEHB-related provisions to PSHB
- Support opt-out for Part D for postal annuitants
- Oppose fast-track consideration of legislation that could include cuts to earned benefits
- Support allowing in-plan Roth conversions for TSP participants
- Support lifetime identity theft protection for victims of OPM security breaches
- Support coverage of assistive reproductive technology services
- Support delegation of authority to agencies to rehire annuitants without salary offset



- Do:
  - Raise NARFE-PAC funds at every chapter and federation meeting
  - Tell members why NARFE-PAC is important
  - Explain the giving levels and incentives
  - Have incentives and promotional materials on hand
  - Remember that only NARFE members can contribute to NARFE-PAC

## PAC Dos and Don'ts



- Don't:
  - Talk about NARFE-PAC in a congressional office
     OK at fundraising events
  - Suggest a quid pro quo of PAC funds for official acts
  - Use chapter funds to contribute to NARFE-PAC
  - Forget that contributions to NARFE-PAC are not tax-deductible
