LEGISLATION

Federal

The Social Security Fairness Act of 2023, The Social Security Fairness Act, <u>H.R.82/S.597</u> would fully repeal the WEP and GPO. H.R.82 had 330 co-sponsors. S.597 has 62 co-sponsors including both Virginia Senators.

On November 12, we witnessed a historic moment with the Social Security Fairness Act, H.R. 82, to repeal the windfall elimination provision (WEP) and the government pension offset (GPO), passing the House with overwhelming majority 327-75. Now it's essential that we keep our advocacy strong in working to have S.597 be brought to the Senate floor. Only seven legislative days remain in the current session of Congress. If the senate bill doesn't come to the floor for a vote, or doesn't pass if it does, we start all over in a new 119th Congress and a new administration. <u>None of the legislators in the House and Senate who introduced the bills in each chamber will be returning in the next congress.</u>

The momentum for repealing WEP and GPO is strong. Lawmakers on both sides of the aisle are calling on Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer to schedule a vote on the bill that would expand Social Security benefits to roughly 2.8 million retirees. Schumer, a Democrat and cosponsor of the legislation, could invoke a Senate rule that would skip a committee hearing and send the bill directly to a floor vote by the full Senate. "With just eight legislative days remaining in the 118th Congress, Sen. Schumer, a cosponsor of Senate bill S.597, must now step up and take action.

In an impassioned <u>speech</u>, Louisiana Republican Sen. Bill Cassidy Cassidy called on Schumer to schedule a vote, saying lawmakers would approve the legislation. "If Schumer brings it up, it'll pass," Cassidy stated of the bill.
